ANNEXURE - A

A- Term of Reference

- We understand that the client will provide adequate safety and security to the consultant and its staff at sites and during travelling to sites.
- Restrictions in consultant's movement due to security issue, if occurred, would result
 in adjusting the delivery of outputs and associated costs.
- Covid-19 pandemic and other epidemic when declared as calamity by the government will be dealt accordingly to the contract clauses.

B- On Counterpart Staff and Facilities

- Permission to enter the project related area properly
- Client will provide all existing data and study reports
- Necessary letters of introduction to the other departments / agencies / offices, where the Consultants may need to visit for the assignment.

C- Scope of Services / Work

The auditors will perform the assigned tasks within the following scope:

- 1. All existing safety practices will be audited, assessed and analyzed
- 2. Assessment will be made to highlight any shortcomings in current safety practices and any additional staffing or procedural practices will be identified
- 3. Compatibility and workability of all safety equipment shall be checked against applicable international standards
- 4. Existing Emergency response mechanisms, arrangements, plans and procedures will be assessed.
- 5. Contingency plans in case of any fire and other hazards will be assessed
- 6. Monitoring mechanisms of safety protocols will be checked
- 7. Routine HSE activities such as Tool Box Talks, Orientation of Workers, First Aid I Fire safety Site Trainings performed by the project owners safety staff for safe mining practices will be assessed.
- 8. Current procedures for Hazard Risk Assessment and issuance of safety warnings to workers and staff will be assessed.



- 9. Systematic identification of safe mining practices;
- a. Assessment of traffic rules for heavy earth moving machinery and dumpers besides,need for the appointment of traffic control staff
- b. Assessment of lighting arrangements at mining sites during night working
- c. Evaluation of safety berms, mine roads, barricading, machinery and other essential designing parameters will be checked against the approved design
- 10. Evaluation will be made for; the existing medical facilities, readiness and equipment required to treat occupational injuries and to cater the outbreak of any occupational diseases. The appointment of qualified medical practitioners at site including satisfactory standard of trauma centers equipped with proper staffing, specialists and burns wards.
- 11. Evaluation of food and hygienic standards provided at workers / employees residential facilities/camp sites will be checked.
- 12. Handling storage and transportation of hazardous substance will be evaluated
- 13. Arrangements for the storage and disposal of infectious I medical waste ,hazardous and solid I kitchen wastes etc. will be checked against the applicable scientific standards and Good International Industry Practices (GIIP) Storage of coal in scientific manner along with mechanism to control the spontaneous combustion of fuel
- 14. Level of PPEs provision and utilization will be checked
- 15. Any adverse HSE impacts of mining activities on nearby communities will be Assessed.
- 16. Evaluation of site security arrangements.
- 17. Evaluation of ambient air quality records.
